## ***White wines by the bottle***

### ***Australia***

***30. 'Metal Label' Vermentino, Berton Vineyard, Eden Valley, South Australia, 2013*** **£22.00**

Pale lemon in colour, a fresh, steely wine with tropical fruit aromas that follow through on to the palate. Rich with great depth of flavour and vibrant acidity.

***31. 'Pedestal' Semillon Sauvignon, Larry Cherubino, Margaret River, Western Australia, 2011*** **£33.50**

A classic Margaret River blend. Partial oak fermentation lends softening layers of texture, whilst retaining clean acidity and freshness. It has savoury aromas and is permeated with flavours of pea pods, citrus and intense minerality.

### ***France***

#### ***Bordeaux***

***32. Entre Deux Mers, Chateau Lestritte, Bordeaux, 2014*** **£24.00**

Pale yellow in colour with golden-green hues and an intense nose of citrus, lime and pear. A wine we love with good minerality, length and balance.

#### ***Languedoc***

***33. Terroir Picpoul de Pinet, Gerard Bertrand, Languedoc, 2014*** **£26.95**

Complex nose reveals notes of white fruit, citrus, honey and white flowers. Full-bodied with zesty fruit and unusual depth, it offers a remarkably crisp freshness.

#### ***Loire***

***34. Sancerre, Domaine Gerard Millet, Loire, 2014*** **£29.50**

Classic Sauvignon notes of grapefruit and lemon on the palate with delicate mineral aromas. Rich yet subtle with good weight and a clean finish.

***35. Sancerre La Moussière, Alphonse Mellot, Loire, 2014*** **£43.00**

With an expressive bouquet of ripe pineapple and grapefruit, this rich wine is balanced by savoury, chalky tones and exquisite freshness on the palate. Pure fruit flavours precede a cool citrus finish with clarity and length.

#### ***Burgundy***

***36. Petit Chablis 'Special Cuvée', Domaine Jean Goulley, Burgundy, 2014*** **£30.00**

Refreshingly crisp with a salty mineral nose and citrus aromas; longer ageing on the lees gives weight before an elegant dry finish.

***37. Chablis 1er Cru Montmains, Domaine Jean Goulley, Burgundy, 2011*** **£45.50**

Intense mineral nose followed by fresh vibrant fruit, crisp acidity and citrus notes. An excellent example of a full-flavoured Chablis.

### *Burgundy (continued)*

- 38. Meursault 'le Limozin' Domaine René Monnier, Burgundy, 2012** £60.00  
An elegant wine with roasted nut and floral fragrances followed by an abundance of lemony fruit with notes of peach and delicate pineapple on the palate. Beautifully well integrated oak and a lovely length.
- 39. Puligny Montrachet 1er Cru, Les Folatieres, Domaine René Monnier 2012** £63.00  
A fresh yet refined wine with good weight opens with aromas of white flowers and hazelnut. Possessed of a generous palate of ripe apricots, honey and minerals before a lingering buttery finish with toasty oak hints.

### *Rhone*

- 40. Condrieu, Terrasses De L'Empire, Domaine Georges Vernay, Rhone, 2011** £75.00  
A delightfully perfumed wine with lychees, peaches, apricots and white flowers on the nose. Fresh tasting with a full, creamy palate: it elegantly exemplifies the appellation.

### *Germany*

- 41. Trittenheimer Apotheke Riesling Spatlese, Weingut Hubertushof, Mosel, 2011** £30.00  
Traditional style of Riesling: full of elegant fruits and notes of golden raisin, wonderfully metered with spices, minerality and fine acidity.

### *Greece*

- 42. 'Ovilos' Semillon Assyrtiko, Ktima Biblia Chora, Pangeon, 2013** £34.00  
Semillon aromas of apricot and honey blend seamlessly with citrus from the Assyrtiko. Green and herbaceous on the palate, with distinctive minerality.

### *Italy*

- 43. Gavi Di Gavi Fossili, San Silvestro, Piemonte, 2014** £24.95  
A spicy wine with citrus aromas, floral undertones and prominent mineral notes. Well balanced, with good structure and a crisp finish.
- 44. Soave Classico DOC Monte Fiorentine, Ca'Rugate, Veneto, 2014** £31.00  
Rich golden colour with a fine bouquet of exotic fruits and meadow flowers. Full flavoured, this is a structured and elegant wine with sweet almonds on the finish.
- 45. Cutizzi Greco di Tufo DOCG, Feudi di San Gregorio, Campania, 2014** £33.00  
Opens with lingering notes of peaches, hawthorn and vanilla with flashes of green leafy mint. A mouth filling texture is balanced with spicy mineral elements and clean acidity with balsamic hints and an elegant, dry finish.

## ***South Africa***

***46. Limited Release Viognier, Swartland Winery, Western Cape, 2015*** **£21.00**

A well-styled Viognier with orange, peach and soft floral jasmine on the nose. Prominent flavours of violets, dried pear and apricot align with delicate oak adding structure and finesse.

***47. Chardonnay, Hamilton Russell, Walker Bay, 2014*** **£42.00**

A tightly structured, mineral-tinged wine characteristic to the Hamilton Russell vineyard. Rich aromas of honeysuckle, peach and pear are balanced with a fresh palate and incisive acidity, length and complexity.

## ***New Zealand***

***48. Premium Sauvignon Blanc, Saint Clair, Marlborough, 2014*** **£28.50**

Intensely flavoured, crisp and powerful, this wine has rich notes of passion fruit, blackcurrant and gooseberry. It is rounded and ripe with a mineral-edged finish.

***49. Wairau Reserve Sauvignon Blanc, Saint Clair, Marlborough, 2014*** **£40.00**

Produced in the esteemed Wairau Valley, an award-winning wine with a tropical bouquet and hints of subtle herbs and gooseberry. Imbued with pure flavours of passion fruit, grapefruit and blackcurrant, it is enhanced with mineral complexity and has a fruity elongated finish.

Delicate with Provence-like colour and an aromatic nose of berries and jasmine. The vivid fruit is pleasantly fresh and dry with underlying notes of savouriness, subtle spice and lemon zest.		
<b>53. <i>Château Lestrille, Clairet, Bordeaux 2014</i></b>		<b>£28.50</b>
Merlot based and deep raspberry in colour, this Clairet has an expressive nose of blackberry and cherry. Fruity with good depth: a superb example of the convergence of traditional – the old Bordeaux word ‘Clairet’ meaning clear or light – and modern winemaking with limited oak and gentle pressing.		

## ***Red wines by the bottle***

### ***Argentina***

- 55. Bonarda, Matias Riccitelli, *The Apple Doesn't Fall Far From The Tree, 2013*** £28.50  
Deep purple in colour with an aroma of red fruit and suggestions of mint and chocolate. A complex wine with smooth ripe tannins and a prolonged, juicy finish.
- 56. Malbec, Matias Riccitelli, *The Apple Doesn't Fall Far From The Tree, 2013*** £33.00  
A well-structured, rich Malbec with black fruits, vanilla and chocolate on the nose entwined with smooth tannins. This young winemaker seeks to express the full potential of the Argentine terroir.
- 57. Vineyard Selection Malbec, Matias Riccitelli, *Mendoza, 2011*** £45.00  
A strikingly full bodied red – aromatic with notes of blackberries and liquorice. Oak-concentrated, yet fresh, with smooth tannins, great structure and a rounded finish. An award winning, modern style of Malbec.

### ***Australia***

- 58. Reserve Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon, Berton Vineyard, *South Australia, 2013*** £28.95  
A full wine with robust tannins and black fruit, tobacco and sweet pepper aromas. Concentrated palate of cassis, minerals and light toasty oak with a persistent finish.
- 59. 'Bonsai' Shiraz, Berton Vineyard, *South Australia, 2012*** £45.00  
Opulent and full flavoured with eucalyptus notes on the nose and spice, ripe fruit and juicy tannins on the palate. Grown and handpicked from small bush vines – hence the name 'Bonsai Shiraz'.

### ***Chile***

- 60. Carmen, *Carmenere Gran Reserva, Colchagua Valley, 2012*** £26.00  
A dense wine with red fruit and earthy cedar on the nose and typical flavours of spice and chocolate. French Oak contributes rounded tannins and a long finish.
- 61. Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon, *Viña Echeverria, Curico Valley, 2012*** £29.95  
Made from grapes handpicked from a family owned, single vineyard, this wine has subtle tannins and a stalky texture with notes of pepper and spice. A pleasantly long finish, rounded and smooth, with a gentle touch of oak.
- 62. 'Litoral' Pinot Noir, *Leyda Valley, 2012*** £31.50  
Bright ruby colour with subtle aromas of fruit and spice; it has a characteristically light Pinot palate of fresh raspberries and red cherries with good acidity and length. Oak aging lends the wine broad, spicy flavours and a satisfying finish.

## *France*

### *Bordeaux*

- 63. Bordeaux Supérieur, Château Lestrille, Bordeaux, 2009** £24.00  
Fresh and aromatic, an unoaked Claret with cassis on the nose and flavours of rich, ripe plum from use of Merlot in the blend. A well-structured, smooth textured wine.
- 64. Haut Medoc, Comte De Senejac, Bordeaux, 2011** £38.00  
A smooth, powerful wine with an expressive nose of black fruits and spices. On the palate, savoury, ripe notes are underpinned by subtle minerality.
- 65. Pomerol, Chateau De Valois, Bordeaux, 2010** £52.00  
A modern style of Pomerol with cassis aromas and hints of subtle toast on the nose. It has flavours of plum and dark stone fruit on the palate alongside ripe tannins. Oak aging adds depth with hints of cedar and vanilla on the finish.
- 66. St. Emilion Grand Cru, Château Boutisse, Bordeaux, 2010** £55.00  
Dense garnet in colour with sweet spices, mocha and grilled bread on the nose. Possessed of a velvety full-bodied palate with fine yet firm tannins and notes of black fruit, it has accents of subtle vanilla and charcoal.
- 67. Brio de Cantenac, Château Cantenac Brown, Margaux, Bordeaux, 2010** £58.00  
Smoke, tobacco and blackcurrant aromas precede soft, silky tannins, cedar notes and a youthful palate. Use of Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc adds subtle flavours with intense aromas and Merlot contributes richness and roundness.

### *Rhone*

- 68. Syrah, Château de Campuget, 1753 Costières de Nîmes, Rhone, 2013** £28.00  
Classic Syrah aromas of leather and chocolate with a velvety liquorice spice character on the palate. Made without oak to maintain the fruit character.
- 69. Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Château Fortia, Tradition Red, Rhone, 2010** £55.00  
A traditionally styled wine with aromas of bay leaf, earthy figs and blackberries. Full of rich dark fruit flavours with a touch of liquorice and crunchy tannins before a long finish tinged with wood spice.

### *Languedoc*

- 70. Corbieres, Domaine de Georges Bertrand, Languedoc, 2011** £39.95  
Opening with aromas of garrigue and spice with hints of red fruits, this deep purple wine has soft, ripe tannins and a complex palate before a powerful, elongated finish.

### *Burgundy*

- 71. Beaune 1er Cru Les Teurons, Domaine Albert Morot, Burgundy, 2011** £72.00  
A rich, classic style of Burgundy with a nose of cherry, raspberry and just hints of earthiness. On the palate, smooth raspberry and ripe 'Pinot' fruit with silky tannins. Well concentrated and full flavoured.

## *Greece*

- 72. Avaton, Domaine Gerovassiliou, Epanomi, 2011** **£26.95**  
Local grape varieties of Mavrotagano, Limnio and Mavroudi combine to create a wine of complex structure. Full flavoured with blackberry fruit, spice and significant depth, this wine has a dry finish and is totally individual.

## *Italy*

- 73. Sigismondo Sangiovese di Romagna Superiore, Gruppo Cevico, Emilia Romagna, 2013** **£25.00**

Savoury, smooth and fresh with subtle notes of cherry and dark fruits. An oaked wine with inherent warmth and richness that is reminiscent of a Chianti.

- 74. Refosco Isonzo 'Pucino', Collavini, Friuli Venezia Giulia, 2014** **£28.00**

Lightly floral on the nose with violet notes and beautifully balanced blackberry and raspberry on the palate. A short burst of complex flavours before a delicate finish.

- 75. 62 Anniversario Primitivo Di Manduria Riserva DOC, Cantine San Marzano, Puglia 2010** **£47.50**

A deep and complex nose of prunes, cherry jam, spice and tobacco with flavours of cocoa, coffee and vanilla. Red, iron rich, "Terra Rossa" soils contribute mineral freshness and fine tannins before a long and savoury finish.

- 76. Amarone DOCG, Ca'Rugate, Veneto, 2012** **£57.00**

With concentrated sweet fruit aromas of currants, blueberries and cherries, this is an elegant and complex Amarone. Well balanced, and enhanced with a hint of spicy oak, it is full bodied with a lingering finish.

- 77. Barolo Riserva DOCG, Costa di Bussia, Piemonte, 2010** **£60.00**

A modern style of Barolo with aromas of crushed-flowers, plums and earthy mushrooms alongside hints of mint. On the palate, intensely floral and complex with an almost savoury character alongside the sweet fruits.

## *Lebanon*

- 78. Reserve du Couvent, Château Ksara, Bekaa Valley, 2013** **£24.50**

A powerful nose of rich cherry, blackberry with coffee tints and a touch of earth. Medium-bodied palate is generous with fruit and ripe tannins before a long finish.

## *Spain*

- 79. Rioja Reserva, Bodegas Ondarre, Rioja 2010** **£26.50**

A deep and concentrated Rioja with spicy nuances and leather on the nose. Smooth and subtle palate with fine grained tannins and concentrated fruit flavours.

### *Spain (continued)*

**80. 'Quasar' Rioja Gran Reserva, Bodegas Ondarre, Rioja 2008** **£35.00**

A mature wine with earthy, savoury notes and complex aromatics of red berries, liquorice and hints of smoke. Smooth, prolonged flavour with good backbone.

**81. 'Macula' Cabernet Sauvignon Merlot, Tandem, Navarra, 2006** **£38.00**

Opens with a smoky, toasty nose with hints of cloves and black pepper. The distinctive terroir and use of well-ripened Cabernet and Merlot imparts subtle minerality with notes of scrubland, balsamic and dark chocolate. A full, powerful and wonderfully balanced wine with a rich meaty finish.

### *South Africa*

**82. Bush Vines Pinotage, Swartland Winery, Western Cape, 2013** **£26.00**

Brick red hue typical of the region with black fruit and savoury earthy aromas. Medium bodied wine with fresh dark fruits against dark spice and smokiness on the palate complemented by firm tannins.

### *USA*

**83. Reserve Selection Cabernet Sauvignon, Raymond Vineyards, Napa Valley, 2012** **£49.00**

Full-bodied and rich, this wine opens with enticing aromas of mocha, black fruits and sweet tobacco. Notes of black cherries and raspberries are enhanced by peppery flavours and compounded with well-integrated tannins and a good structure.
